## The Sign of the Prophet Jonah

**The Sign of the Prophet Jonah (Matt 12:38-41)** - The Work of Jonah prefigured the work of the Lord Jesus Christ. He sacrificed himself for his people, was subjected to a death and resurrection, and afterwards preached repentance to the Gentiles.

**"For as Jonas was a sign unto the Ninevites, so shall also the Son of man be to this generation."** (Luke 11:30) - Jonah preached that unless Nineveh repented, it would fall within 40 days. Christ did likewise to his generation (Matt 24:34-35) and within 40 prophetic days (on a day for a year principle) Jerusalem fell (AD 70). The sign should have taught the Lord's contemporaries that the time for reformation was limited, and that the time was ripe for preaching repentance to the Gentiles.
