


READ

The Egyptians believed in life after death in the kingdom of Osiris who was the God of the dead. They had a book of magic spells to help them pass the Judgement of Anubis. 

Questions:

These are fairly random trivia type questions. If you are reading with children, you could ask one before you read and let them find the answer as you are reading. Or you could use them to play a review type game after reading through a few chapters. Or you could test yourself after reading through the book and see how many you can answer correctly. There is one question for each chapter.

Exodus 1 What were the names of the stores cities that the people of Israel built?	Exodus 2 How many daughters did the priest of Midian have?
Exodus 3 What did God tell Moses was His name?	Exodus 4 What would Aaron be for Moses?
Exodus 5 The people were to make the same number of bricks but would no longer be given what?	Exodus 6 Why did the people not listen to Moses?
Exodus 7 How did Moses and Aaron when they came to speak to Pharaoh?	Exodus 8 What did the people have to do with the frogs?
Exodus 9 What did Moses throw into the air before Pharaoh?	Exodus 10 What kind of wind brought the locust?
