


THE BUILDING HARP





HOW TO MAKE IT.


FOLD A PIECE OF PAPER INTO SEVEN PANELS. DRAW ON A FIGURE AS SHOWN HERE. CUT OUT THE AREAS WHICH ARE SHADED AND UNFOLD. IF SCHOLARS ARE AT THE WRITING STAGE THEY CAN WRITE "THE LORD HAS NOT

CHOSEN THESE!

AS AN ALTERNATIVE MAKE & FIGURES INSTEAD OF 7. MAKE THE EIGHTH FIGURE WITH A HAPPY FACE AND WITH DAVID WRITTEN ON IT.


BADGE

COPY THE LAMB BELOW ONTO A PIECE OF CARD. GLUE COTTON WOOL THINLY ON THE LAMB AND ATTACH A SAFETY PIN.



HOW TO MAKE IT.

TRANSFER THE HARP PATTERN ONTO THICK CARD, PUNCH HOLES OVER THE SIX DOTS, TOP AND BOTTOM, USING WOOL THREAD THROUGH THE HOLES FROM TOP TO BOTTOM, THEN BOTTOM TO TOP ETC. UNTIL YOU HAVE FINISHED.



SPOOL



MATERIALS REQUIRED.

STIFF WHITE CARDBOARD A A AMALL COTTON SPOOL OR IF THIS IS NOT AVAILABLE


CUT UP SHORT LENGTHS OF BROOM HANDLE.

GLUE COTTON WOOL SCISSORS.

HOW TO MAKE IT.

FRONT OF THE LAMB
PICTURED HERE. USE
FAIRLY THICK CARD





AS THE LAMB MUST STAND UPON THESE TWO PIECES OF CARD. COLOUR THE GRASS GREEN. COVER THE SPOOL WITH GLUE (EXCEPT THE ENDS) AND PUTON SOME COTTON WOOL TO MAKE THE LAMB WOOLLY. GLUE THE BACK AND FRONT OF THE LAMB TO THE ENDS OF THE SPOOL. PLACE THE LAMB ON END FOR A FEW MINUTES UNTIL THE GLUE DRIES.

FINGER PRINT SHEED.

BRING ALONG A STAMP PAD TO CLASS. CHILDREN CAN DRAW SIMPLE SHEEP USING THEIR FINGER PRINTS AS A BASIS








A FOLID

MATERIALS REQUIRED.

A SHEET OF THIN CARD OR THICK PAPER. • GWE • SCISSORS OR CRAFT KNIFE.



HOW TO MAKE IT.

DIVIDE THE CARD INTO 48 SQUARES. IF THE CARD IS 6" X 8" THEN DIVIDING INTO I" SQUARES WILL GIVE YOU 48 SQUARES IN ALL.

* CUT ALONG THE DOUBLE LINES.

* CUT OUT THE SHADED DOORS.

* FOLD ON THE DOTTED LINES.

FOLD (D.F. F.) FORWARD ALONG

FOLD (D.E.F) FORWARD ALONG THE DOTTED LINES, TO FORM THE SHELTER. GLUE X LINDER Z TO MAKE THE FRONT FENCE STAND UP. THE STRIPS A.B.C ARE PASTED ALONG THE BACK OF THE SHELTER. THE FOLD CAN BE COLOURED BEFORE MAKING IT UP. PAINT THE FLOOR GREEN OR STICK ON A SHEET OF GREEN PAPER.
