

sight, <sup>b</sup> shew me now thy way, that I may know thee, that I may find grace in thy sight: and consider that this nation is <sup>d</sup> thy people.

14 And he said, <sup>e</sup> My presence shall go *with thee*, and I will give thee <sup>f</sup> rest.

15 And he said unto him, <sup>g</sup> If thy presence go not *with me*, carry us not up hence.

16 For wherein shall it be known here that I and thy people have found grace in thy sight? <sup>i</sup> *is it* not in that thou goest with us? so <sup>l</sup> shall we be separated, I and thy people, from all the people that *are* upon the face of the earth.

17 And the LORD said unto Moses, I will do this thing also that thou hast spoken: for <sup>m</sup> thou hast found grace in my sight, and <sup>o</sup> I know thee by name.

18 And he said, I beseech thee, shew me <sup>p</sup> thy glory.

19 And he said, I will make all <sup>r</sup> my goodness pass before thee, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD before thee; <sup>s</sup> and will be <sup>t</sup> gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will shew mercy on whom I will shew mercy.

20 And he said, Thou canst not see my face: for <sup>v</sup> there shall no man see me, and live.

21 And the LORD said, Behold, <sup>w</sup> *there is* a place by me, and thou shalt stand upon a rock:

22 And it shall come to pass, while my glory passeth by, that I will put thee <sup>x</sup> in a cliff of the rock, and will <sup>y</sup> cover thee with my hand while I pass by:

23 And I will take away mine hand, and thou shalt see my back parts: but my face shall <sup>z</sup> not be seen.

#### CHAPTER 34.

<sup>1</sup> The tables are renewed. <sup>5</sup> The name of the LORD proclaimed. <sup>29</sup> Moses' face shineth.

**A**ND the LORD said unto Moses, <sup>h</sup> Hew thee two tables

of stone like unto the first: <sup>b</sup> and I will write upon *these* tables the words that were in the first tables, <sup>c</sup> which thou brakest.

2 And be ready in the morning, and come up in the morning unto mount Sinai, and present thyself there to me <sup>f</sup> in the top of the mount.

3 And no man shall <sup>h</sup> come up with thee, neither let any man be seen throughout all the mount; neither let the flocks nor herds feed before that mount.

4 ¶ And he hewed two tables of stone like unto the first; and Moses rose up early in the morning, and went up unto mount Sinai, as the LORD had commanded him, and took in his hand the two tables of stone.

5 And the LORD descended in the cloud, and stood with him there, and <sup>i</sup> proclaimed the name of the LORD.

6 And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, <sup>j</sup> The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and <sup>k</sup> gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in <sup>l</sup> goodness and <sup>m</sup> truth,

7 <sup>n</sup> Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, and <sup>o</sup> that will by no means clear *the guilty*; visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and to the fourth *generation*.

8 And Moses made haste, and <sup>p</sup> bowed his head toward the earth, and worshipped.

9 And he said, If now I have found grace in thy sight, O Lord, <sup>q</sup> let my Lord, I pray thee, go among us; for <sup>r</sup> *it is* a stiff-necked people; and pardon our iniquity and our sin, and take us for <sup>s</sup> *thine inheritance*.
