




Get to know a buttertly

The Common Buckeye

Family: Nymphalidae

Sub-Family: Nymphalinae Latin Name: Junonia coenia



This butterfly likes open land and can often be found where the ground has been disturbed such as agricultural areas. The mother butterflies lay a single pale green, ribbed egg on the tips of the leaves of plants such as plantain, figwort, gerardia, and related plants. Less than a week later these hatch into spiny gray, black or reddish caterpillars.

The caterpillars eat the leaves (often just between the veins), flowers, and fruit of their host plant, going through five instars, before changing into a pale brown, ridged chrysalis and emerging as a butterfly a couple weeks later.

The butterflies enjoy plants where the nectar is easy to reach such as asters, coreopsis and herbs such as peppermint.

In colder climates, where there is a winter period, the late caterpillar or butterfly will often hibernate.

"A call to regeneration without the transformation of the prophet is worse than valueless. Disciples whose words have lost the support of their conduct will never save men from corruption. It may be welcomed as a haven of rest by the weary traveler, it may be avoided as a den of vice, but it cannot be hid. A man who claims discipleship cannot be ignored. His profession has elevated him and he stands exposed to the public gaze for good or ill. In all ages men will assess Christ not so much by his precepts as by the lives of men and women they see and know, who profess to be his disciples. This is as it should be. Jesus told the Twelve that this many-sided character which would develop under his care was not to be a cloistered virtue. They were men with a work to do. That work was the salvation of men and the glory of God. It would only be accomplished when they let their light shine that men, seeing their good works, would glorify their Father."

Jesus came to make God known to the world. How did his life match up with what he said? What did he do to help him remember his purpose?

- (1) O give thanks unto the LORD; call upon his name: make known his deeds among the people.

- (4) Seek the LORD, and his strength: seek his face evermore.
- (5) Remember his marvellous works that he hath done; his wonders, and the judgments of his mouth;
- (6) O ye seed of Abraham his servant, ye children of Jacob his chosen.
- (7) He is the LORD our God: his judgments are in all the earth.
- (8) He hath remembered his covenant for ever, the word which he commanded to a thousand generations.
- (9) Which covenant he made with Abraham, and his oath unto Isaac;
- (10) And confirmed the same unto Jacob for a law, and to Israel for an everlasting covenant:
- (11) Saying, Unto thee will I give the land of Canaan, the lot of your inheritance:
- (12) When they were but a few men in number; yea, very few, and strangers in it.
- (13) When they went from one nation to another, from one kingdom to another people;
- (14) He suffered no man to do them wrong: yea, he reproved kings for their sakes;
- (15) Saying, Touch not mine anointed, and do my prophets no harm.
- (16) Moreover he called for a famine upon the land: he brake the whole staff of bread.
- (17) He sent a man before them, even Joseph, who was sold for a servant:
- (18) Whose feet they hurt with fetters: he was laid in iron:
- (19) Until the time that his word came: the word of the LORD tried him.
- (20) The king sent and loosed him; even the ruler of the people, and let him go free.
- (21) He made him lord of his house, and ruler of all his substance:
- (22) To bind his princes at his pleasure; and teach his senators wisdom.
- (23) Israel also came into Egypt; and Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.
- (24) And he increased his people greatly; and made them stronger than their enemies.
- (25) He turned their heart to hate his people, to deal subtilly with his servants.
- (26) He sent Moses his servant; and Aaron whom he had chosen.
- (27) They shewed his signs among them, and wonders in the land of Ham.
- (28) He sent darkness, and made it dark; and they rebelled not against his word.
- (29) He turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish.
- (30) Their land brought forth frogs in abundance, in the chambers of their kings.
- (31) He spake, and there came divers sorts of flies, and lice in all their coasts.
- (32) He gave them hail for rain, and flaming fire in their land.
- (33) He smote their vines also and their fig trees; and brake the trees of their coasts.
- (34) He spake, and the locusts came, and caterpillers, and that without number,
- (35) And did eat up all the herbs in their land, and devoured the fruit of their ground.
- (36) He smote also all the firstborn in their land, the chief of all their strength.
- (37) He brought them forth also with silver and gold: and there was not one feeble person among their tribes.
- (38) Egypt was glad when they departed: for the fear of them fell upon them.
- (39) He spread a cloud for a covering; and fire to give light in the night.
- (40) The people asked, and he brought quails, and satisfied them with the bread of heaven.
- (41) He opened the rock, and the waters gushed out; they ran in the dry places like a river.
- (42) For he remembered his holy promise, and Abraham his servant.
- (43) And he brought forth his people with joy, and his chosen with gladness:
- (44) And gave them the lands of the heathen: and they inherited the labour of the people;
- (45) That they might observe his statutes, and keep his laws. Praise ye the LORD.
