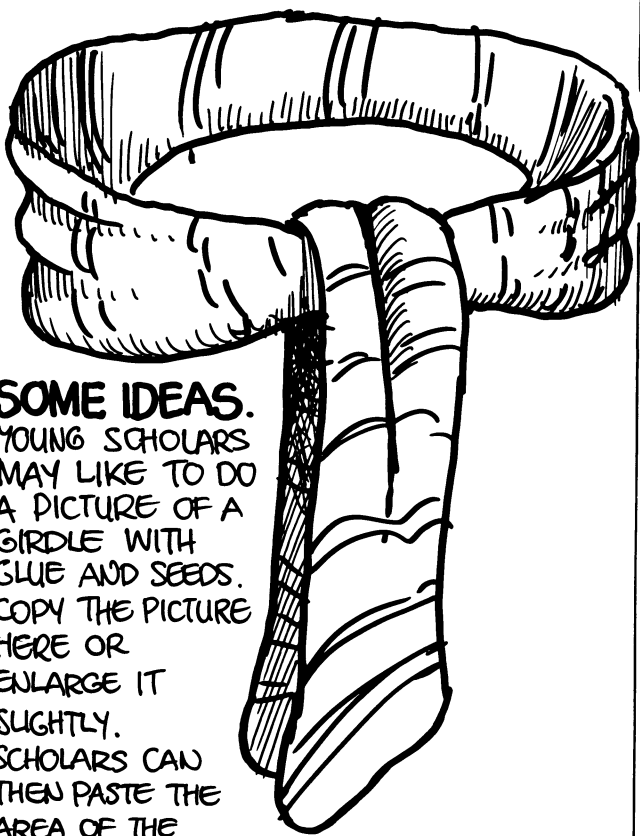


Paul Goes to Jerusalem

PAUL'S GIRDLE



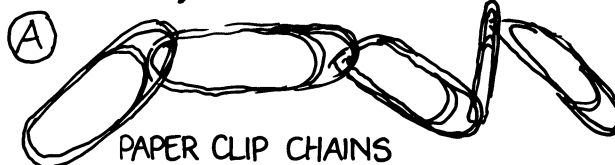
SOME IDEAS.

YOUNG SCHOLARS MAY LIKE TO DO A PICTURE OF A GIRDLE WITH GLUE AND SEEDS. COPY THE PICTURE HERE OR ENLARGE IT SLIGHTLY. SCHOLARS CAN THEN PASTE THE AREA OF THE GIRDLE THEN SPRINKLE SOME SEEDS ON TOP WHILE THE GLUE IS STILL WET.

A REAL GIRDLE CAN BE MADE FROM REMNANTS OF MATERIAL. SCHOLARS WILL BE IMPRESSED WITH THE LESSON IF THEY LEAVE SUNDAY SCHOOL WITH ONE AROUND THEIR WAIST.

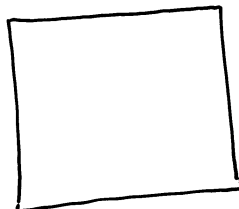

PAUL in CHAINS WAYS & MAKING CHAINS

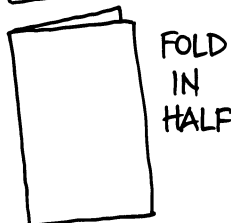


PAPER CLIP CHAINS

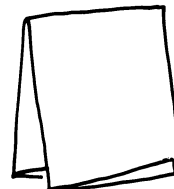
(B) PAPER CHAINS CAN BE MADE FROM NEWSPAPER ETC.



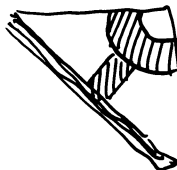
START WITH A SQUARE PIECE OF PAPER ANY REASONABLE SIZE



FOLD IN HALF

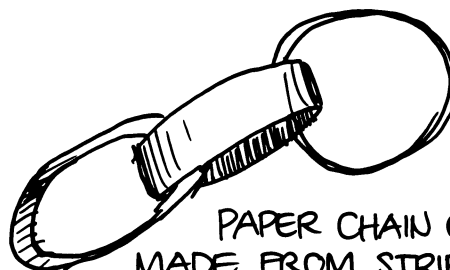


AND IN HALF AGAIN.



FOLD DIAGONALLY ONCE OR TWICE. DRAW PATTERN AS SHOWN

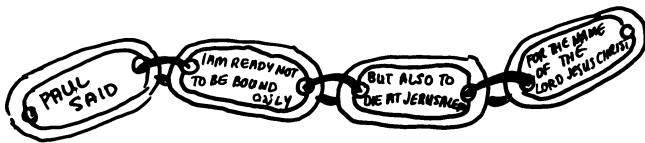
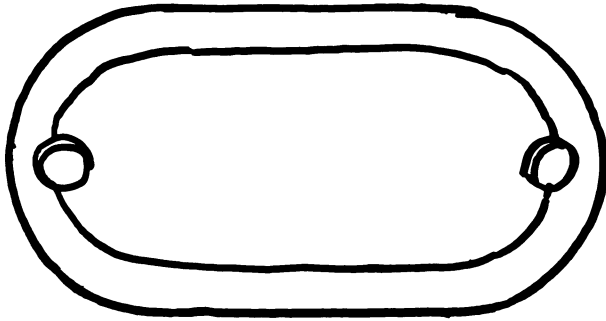
TEAR OUT THE WHITE AREAS AND THEN OPEN OUT TO REVEAL THE CHAIN.



PAPER CHAIN CAN BE MADE FROM STRIPS OF PAPER GLUED TOGETHER OR STRIPS OF COLOURED GUMMED PAPER.

WORD CHAINS

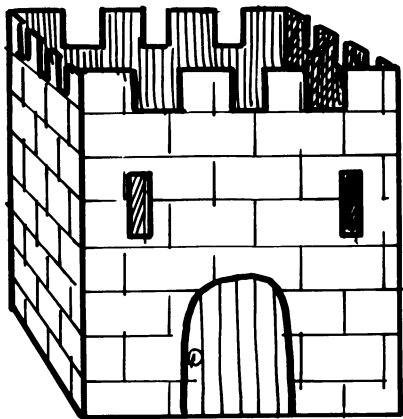
ESPECIALLY INTERESTING FOR THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN READING FOR A SHORT TIME AT SCHOOL.



AS AN ALTERNATIVE THE CHAINS CAN BE LINKED TOGETHER WITH PAPER FASTENERS.

COPY A NUMBER OF CHAIN PATTERNS (AS PROVIDED ABOVE). WRITE SECTIONS OF VERSES ON EACH. SCHOLARS TO JOIN UP THE CHAINS TO MAKE THE COMPLETE VERSE. TIE WITH WOOL.

MODEL CASTLE

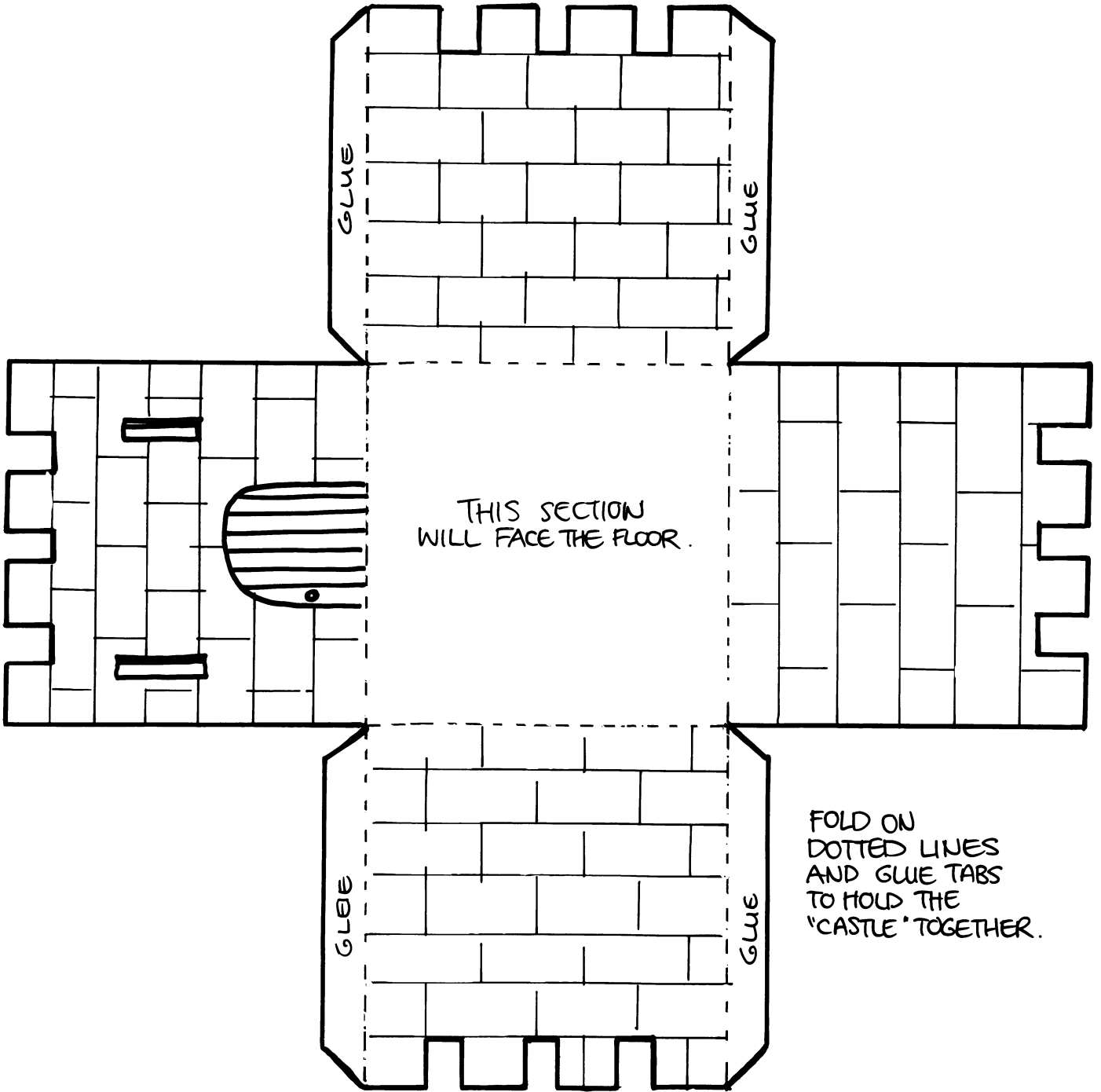


MATERIALS REQUIRED.

COPY AND CUT OUT PATTERN ON PAGE 81. FOLD AND GLUE AS DIRECTED. CHILDREN MAY LIKE TO COLOUR WITH PAINT OR FELT-TIP PENS.



FOLD ON
DOTTED LINES
AND GLUE TABS
TO HOLD THE
'CASTLE' TOGETHER.
