Evolution: The Big Lie!

The first chapter of the Bible, Genesis 1, makes it very clear that God created life on our planet Earth. Some people who do not believe in God and do not read the Bible, have created a different explanation for why there are living creatures on our planet. They call their way of explaining the origin of life "evolution".

FIG 15: Monkey Business. Evolutionists believe that life originated and developed through a purely accidental and aimless natural process. The probability of life arising in such a manner is comparable to the probability of a monkey typing a perfect unabridged dictionary.



What Is Evolution?

Some day you will probably learn about evolution in school, if you haven't already heard about it in your classes. Evolution is a belief that life developed on our planet by pure chance over millions and millions of years, without God being involved at all! According to evolution, all of a sudden

one day a simple living creature just happened to develop and come to life. Then that creature produced more and more. Over time these simple creatures supposedly changed into more complex animals like monkeys and then finally developed into the human people we see today! What a ridiculous story. People who believe in evolution will tell you that one of your ancestors millions of years ago was like a monkey and before that one was even a fish!

Some scientists who know evolution can not be true, compare it to taking all the little pieces that make up a watch, putting them in a box, shaking the box, and then looking to see if the watch is all put together and working when you open the box! Imagine taking apart a computer, with all its tiny electronic chips and circuits, and then suggesting that all these parts developed by chance and just happened to come together into a working computer. Evolution is less likely to happen than even that!

Our wonderful bodies that God has made are many, many times more complicated than the best computers around today. How could anyone think they just evolved! Our complicated bodies must have been created by someone very intelligent – our God in Heaven.

Our Creator Has a Plan!

You can sure thank God that He has allowed you to read and understand the Bible so that you don't have to turn to silly ideas like evolution. We know that God created this earth, with all the plants, animals and people so that they will bring glory to Him. He tells us: "For as truly as I live, all the earth will be filled with my glory" (Num. 14:21). God has a plan to fill this earth with people who learn to live like Him. His plan has nothing do with chance. He has carefully thought out and developed a 7,000-year plan to save people so they can live with Him forever.

Many people who believe in evolution want it to be true so that they will not have to worship and serve their Creator. We know our God created man in His

own image and likeness. With our understanding we have the responsibility to try to learn about our Creator and what

"Come out from among them and be separate, says the Lord. Do not touch what is unclean, and I will receive you."

(2 Cor. 6:17)


He would like us to do. Sometimes this means we must not say or do things that would upset our God. We cannot join in with the children of this world who say bad words or unkind things to each other. We cannot watch the evil movies and TV programs like other children do who do not believe in God. But in the end, we know that it will be worth it because our God has a

fantastic future reward for us and we have the opportunity of living forever!

God Did NOT Create Through Evolution!

There are some people today who think God slowly created our world over millions and millions of years through evolution. These people would like to believe in evolution and God at the same time. The Bible clearly indicates that this cannot be true. The Apostle Paul claims that nothing of our world died until Adam and Eve sinned. He says:

"Therefore, just as through one man (Adam) sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned." (Romans 5:12)



Death Did Not Come by Chance - It is a Punishment

According to Paul, no one died until Adam had sinned. People who believe in evolution think creatures were living and dying for millions of years before any people even developed. The Bible points out over and over again that people die because of sin. Death is not something that just happened to come about by chance.

It is a punishment sent by God because Adam and Eve sinned. God said to Adam after he sinned:

"In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread till you return to the ground, For out of it you were taken; For dust you are, and to dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19)

Paul adds to this:

"For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23)

Many people who believe in evolution do not want to acknowledge their sins. They would prefer to think that they are basically good and have no need for forgiveness of sins and salvation. They do not want to admit there is a God who created us and that we have a responsibility to try to know and serve Him. Because of the evil life that a belief in evolution can develop in people, many Bible readers who understand creation have correctly pronounced the word "EVIL-lution".

God Will Let Everyone Know that He is our Creator

The day is soon coming when Jesus Christ will return and set up His Father's kingdom. There will be no doubts in that day about God being the Creator of our world, because He says:

"Thus I will magnify Myself and sanctify Myself, and I will be known in the eyes of many nations.. Then they shall know that I am the Lord." (Ezekiel 38:23)

Right now we have the opportunity to know our Creator by reading of Him and His plan in the Bible. Let's try to do this everyday! We have the fantastic privilege of learning about our God and understand why He has created our world, so that one day we might live with Him forever. May we learn a lesson from one of the wisest men who ever lived – Solomon, when he said:

"Remember NOW your Creator in the days of your youth, Before the difficult days come and the years draw near when you say, 'I have no pleasure in them.'" (Ecclesiastes 12:1)

The Story of Job

Have you ever noticed that sometimes wicked people are rich and in good health, while some good people are poor or sick? That may seem unfair to us, but the story of Job explains why God makes some people rich and others poor, and why He gives some people good health and makes others sick. The answer may surprise you!



Although the book of Job comes after Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther in our Bibles, Job probably lived some time during the years between Abraham and Moses. Many people think Moses actually wrote the book of Job.

Job was a good man who lived in the land of Uz, somewhere south and east of the Dead Sea around Edom. The Bible says Job was "blameless and upright, one who feared God, and turned away from evil" (Job 1:1). Job was married and had 7 sons and 3 daughters, thousands of animals, and many servants. He was the greatest of all the people who lived in his country.

Job's Adversaries Want God to Destroy Him

Some people who knew Job thought that he only served God because God had given him so much. They thought that if God took away Job's riches, his family and his health then he would become wicked and quit serving God. The Bible refers to one of the people who felt this way about Job as "Satan". The Hebrew word "Satan" means "adversary", and these people were certainly adversaries to Job because they wanted God to destroy him!

God decided to prove to Job's adversary that Job was really sincere and that Job would serve God no matter what happened to him. So God brought a series of disasters on Job to take away his riches, family and health. First, the Sabeans came and killed his servants. Then the fire of God fell from heaven and burned up his sheep and some servants. The Chaldeans took his camels and killed more servants. Finally, a strong wind blew over the house where his children were and killed them all.

What a series of disasters! Yet even after all these terrible events, Job worshipped God and said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return; the Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord" (Job 1:21).

After all this, God gave Job a terrible disease with boils on his skin and fever in his bones. This illness continued for many days. Job's wife even said "curse God, and die!" But Job held fast to his belief in God and reminded her "shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil?" (Job 2:10)

Job's 3 Friends Come to Visit

While Job was sick and suffering, three of his friends came to see him. They were Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar. These 3 men, like Job, misunderstood the reasons God brings suffering upon people. They thought God punished everyone with suffering according to how bad they sinned. So if a person did many bad sins then God would punish them during their life with lots of terrible suffering. On the other hand, the 3 friends thought if you serve God and do good things then God will bless you with riches and health. These men misunderstood why God brings suffering on good people.

Job's friends looked at him suffering from his illness and heard about all the disasters that had happened to him. They told Job that he must have done some really bad things for God to punish him like this. Job didn't understand why all this evil was happening to him, but he did know that he had not done some real bad thing for which God was punishing him. His 3 friends kept telling him to confess his great sins, but Job kept responding that he had not done any great evil. After talking with his friends many times, Job finally decided that God must be wrong! He wanted to talk to God and defend himself. Job was wrong to claim that God had made a mistake.

Elihu Explains God's use of Suffering to Prevent Sin

At this point, a young man named Elihu stepped in and explained to Job and his friends that God sometimes uses suffering to prevent people from falling away from the Truth and to increase their faith in God. Elihu explained that Job's suffering was not any punishment at all! It is so hard for God to keep us from getting involved in the evils of this world that sometimes God has to put us through terrible circumstances like accidents and sickness so we will not get involved in bad things. Job and his friends had never looked at suffering this way.

God Tells Job that He wants to Save Many

After Elihu talked to Job, God spoke to Job too. God explained to Job that He loves all men and wants everyone to be saved. Sometimes God has to make good people suffer so He can convince everyone that good people serve God because it is the right thing to do, and not because God gives them health or riches. God reminded Job how clearly He has demonstrated this lesson in nature every time an innocent lamb dies so that a wild lion can have food and live.

God Required Jesus to Suffer for Hmself and Us

God's best example of this use of suffering came many years later when He gave His son Jesus to suffer and die for us, to show us the way to live. Jesus didn't do anything wrong, but God required him to go through the agony of crucifixion to prevent Jesus himself from sinning during his life, and to convince us and other sinners that we must join with Jesus and destroy our own evil desires to live for God.

When God was finished explaining to Job why he had to suffer, Job was really sorry that he had ever questioned that God was right for everything that had happened to him. Job finally understood how hard God was working all the time to save people. God's love for all people is very great and He uses many different ways to try to convince people to hate sin and to live for the kingdom.

God Proved Job's Adversaries were Wrong!

Through everything that happened to Job, God proved to Job's adversary that Job served God and lived the way he did because he believed it was the right thing to do, and not just because of his riches, family or health. God hoped this would cause Job's adversary and others like him to learn from Job the right way to live. Job's experiences helped the people in his day and in the days to come to understand how God uses suffering and trouble to help save us. Even Jesus Christ probably learned a lot about his own suffering by reading through the story of Job.

Job Restored and Given Twice as Much as Before

In the end, God restored Job to good health, gave him twice as many animals and servants as he had before, and blessed him with 10 more children. Thanks to the patience of Job as he endured all his troubles, we can now better understand how God uses troubles and calamities in our lives to save us and many others as well. When we go through bad times in the future, think of Job, all that happened to him, how he patiently endured, and the life of Job will help us endure our troubles so we will be ready to meet Job in God's kingdom!







The Mistake of Nadab and Abihu

The people of Israel spent about six months making the tabernacle and all its furniture. After the tabernacle was finished, God gave them instructions for offering sacrifices to Him. Leviticus 8 explains that Moses then spent seven days preparing Aaron and his sons to act as priests for the Israelites. Aaron only had four sons at this time: Nadab, Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar. So their were only five men who could serve as priests in the tabernacle.

Moses offered special sacrifices for Aaron and his sons, and then sprinkled them with anointing oil and blood so they could officially become the priests of God. For seven days Aaron and his sons had to stay in the tabernacle, night and day, until the week of special preparation was over. The people of Israel were anxious to begin using the tabernacle and bring their offerings to Aaron and his sons. Now at last, the day had come when the people could finally use the tabernacle for worship!



The Priests' First Day

Leviticus 9 describes the first day Aaron and his sons began operating as priests working in the tabernacle. Aaron offered a sin offering for himself first. He then offered sin, burnt, peace and meal offerings for the people. It was an exciting time as the people saw the altar of burnt offering being used and their sacrifices placed upon it. Moses and Aaron went into the sanctuary (the meeting tent) and then came back out to bless the

people. To everyone's amazement, the glory of the Lord appeared to all the people, and then fire came from the tent and consumed the offering on the altar. When the people saw this, they shouted and fell on their faces before the Lord.

Nadab and Abihu Offer Strange Fire

Unfortunately, not everyone took this first day seriously. Aaron's two oldest sons, Nadab and Abihu, took their special bowls for offering incense and put some hot coals in the bowls. God had made it very clear in the instructions to Aaron and his sons that they must take hot coals from the altar of the burnt offering for their bowls. Nadab and Abihu did not bother to follow the directions and took their hot coals from somewhere else. They then put incense in their bowls and attempted to burn their incense in the tabernacle. God was very displeased with Nadab and Abihu because they did not follow His directions, so fire came from the tabernacle and burned up Nadab and Abihu, and they died before the Lord.

We Must Carefully Follow God's Word

Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the LORD has said, 'I will show myself holy among those who are near me, and before all the people I will be glorified.'" (Lev. 10:3) Aaron was very upset at the death of his two sons, but he did not argue or complain. He understood that his sons had made a big mistake on the first day they were supposed to be priests for the

people of Israel. Aaron realised that when we worship God and are involved in His service, we must carefully follow the directions He has given us in His word. What a lesson for us teaching us how important it is to read the Bible carefully and learn to follow the instructions God has given us on how we should worship Him today!



When one of our family members or close friends dies, we usually cry and are upset for some time. Back in Moses' time, it was normal to tear your clothes and let your hair hang loose to show everyone you were mourning for someone. But in this case, Moses commanded Aaron, Eleazar and Ithamar that they must not show the normal signs of mourning. Moses wanted it to be clear to the people of Israel that Aaron and his two remaining sons understood why God had killed Nadab and Abihu, and they agreed

with the principle that we must carefully follow God's instructions for worship. Aaron, Eleazar and Ithamar did as Moses commanded them.

Priests Must Not Drink Wine When They Serve

A few minutes after the bodies of Nadab and Abihu were carried out of the camp, God commanded Aaron, "Drink no wine or strong drink, you nor your sons with you, when you go into the tent of meeting, lest you die." (Lev. 10:9) This gives the impression that Nadab and Abihu had probably been drinking too much wine or beer and were drunk when they failed to follow God's instructions and were killed. What an important lesson for us to remember. When people get drunk and make mistakes because they are not in their right mind, God still holds them responsible for the things they do and say when drunk! Let's make sure we never make that mistake even though so many people in the world around us get drunk all the time. Remember the warning of Paul in 1 Cor. 6:9-10: "Do not be deceived; neither the immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor robbers will inherit the kingdom of God."

The death of Nadab and Abihu must have shocked the people of Israel in the midst of their rejoicing on the first day the tabernacle began operating. God knew it was really

important for everyone to learn that they must treat His laws seriously. It is very difficult for God to change us into people who show kindness, mercy, faithfulness and patience. If we carefully follow His laws and do as He says, He will slowly change us into people who learn to live like Him so He can one day give us eternal life. Let's learn from Nadab and Abihu to carefully read our Bibles and try our best to follow the laws of God so He can make us ready for His kingdom.
